We support trained Home visitors who provide weekly visits to selected families to provide a range of Early Childhood Development services including:

- Learning through play
- Parenting support
- Nutrition and Health education

A community Toy Library enriches the ECD services.

LETCEE is committed to strengthening the community's response for young children by working in partnership with the traditional leadership and existing structures.

We are accredited to offer training (qualifications & skills courses) to ECD workers.



PROGRAMME INTEGRATION

Our entry point is Early Childhood Development

Going into family homes to "play with the children" is non-threatening and non-stigmatising.

Home Visitors visit vulnerable families weekly. These visits include:
